### **CURRENT PLANNED WORKS**

All available kerbing has now been lifted and re-laid in Ferry St and we will soon be receiving the line of Italian Porphyry stone band sets which will allow the contractor to base and reopen the footway soon.

Works have also commenced on Castle St with the excavation and widening of the footway on the left-hand side and a temporary pedestrian walkway has been formed on the right-hand side of the street.

This section of works will also re-use the existing kerbs and will also receive the Italian Porphyry stone band sets.

# **Street Lighting**

The street lighting in the Portaferry Public Realm Scheme is being upgraded to meet modern lighting standards, improving the look and safety of the public realm.

The product being used is the Urbis Schreder CITEA NG mini range of lantern heads. These take advantage of the latest LED technology to efficiently light the outdoor space while generating significant energy savings and reducing light pollution.



The luminaires are composed of durable, recyclable materials – a painted aluminium body with a flat tempered glass protector. The lighting is approved by the International Dark Sky Association (IDA) which is the recognised authority on light pollution.

Feature lighting will be installed in Market Square and we will provide you with information on that in future newsletters.


