
CONSULTATION ON DRAFT DOG ON LEADS (NORTH DOWN COASTAL PATH) ORDER 2025

Take note that under the provisions of Part 5 section 40(1) of the Clean Neighbourhoods & Environment Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 that Ards and North Down Borough Council intends to make an Order requiring dogs to be kept on a lead, maximum length 2 meters, on the following lands, in addition to those already in place under The North Down Borough Council Dog on Leads (Promenades and Gardens) Order 2013.

That part of North Down Coastal path fronting dwellings 91 to 117 Station Road, Holywood, BT18 0BU and indicated between lines A and B. The map below may also be viewed on the Council website at <u>www.ardsandnorthdown.gov.uk/dog-control</u>

The Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 The Dog Orders (Prescribed Offences and Penalties etc.) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2012 (S.R. 2012 No 114)

The Ards and North Down Borough Council Dog on Leads (North Down Coastal Path) Order 2025

Ards and North Down Borough Council make the following order -

Commencement

1. This Order comes into operation on xxx 2025.

Application

2. This Order applies to the land being that part of North Down Coastal path fronting dwellings 91 to 117 Station Road, Holywood, BT18 0BU and indicated between lines A and B on the map attached.

Offence

- 3. (1) Any person in charge of a dog is guilty of an offence if, at any time, on any land to which this Order applies the person does not keep the dog on a lead of not more than 2 metres in length, unless-
 - (a) the person has a reasonable excuse for doing so; or
 - (b) the owner, occupier or other person or authority having control of the land has consented (generally or specifically) to the person failing to do so.
 - (2) For the proposes of this Article a person who habitually has a dog in their possession shall be taken to be in charge of the dog at any time unless at that time some other person is in charge of the dog.

Penalty

4. A person guilty of an offence under Article 3 is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
